# Today's Program

Dan Stroski introduced Yolo County District Attorney, and former Club member, Jeff Reisig as our speaker today. Before being elected to his current post Jeff was selected three times by his peers as Prosecutor of the Year in Yolo County.

Jeff was endorsed by prior DA Dave Henderson in his initial election to the office. Jeff ran unopposed in his subsequent reelection.

Jeff gave us an update on key law and order matters in Yolo County. He pointed out that the Yolo County District Attorney's office filed 4913 criminal complaints in 2013. This year that number is increasing. The biggest reason for the increase is property crimes: burglaries and auto thefts. This is particularly true in Woodland according to Jeff.



Jeff attributes the rise in property crimes to the implementation of AB 109, about two years ago, otherwise known as Realignment. This was legislation designed to relieve crowded State prisons by moving many prisoners convicted of less violent crimes to local county jails. This has had the effect of releasing numerous county jail prisoners, many with a history of petty crime and drug addiction, back into local communities where several repeat their earlier crimes. This has led to increased gang activity locally. And Jeff says we are also seeing an increase in domestic violence.



As an extreme example of the increase of domestic violence locally, Jeff gave us a detailed explanation of the case he successfully prosecuted this year in the murder of Leslie Pinkston in Winters by William Gardner III. The murder, which really was an execution, took place on November 18, 2013, exactly one year ago today. The case drew national attention. The jury took just three hours before rendering its guilty verdict. Garner's sentencing is scheduled for December 1<sup>st</sup>. Jeff indicates he expect Gardner will receive a

life sentence.

Jeff also expressed his strong objection and emotional disgust at the passage of Proposition 47 on November  $4^{th}$ . He feels it is the worst thing to happen in California criminal justice in several decades. The new law which is currently being

implemented decriminalizes many felonies into misdemeanors and is expected to result in the release of more than 10,000 convicted felons now in prison. In his opinion, its passage will result in more stolen weapons with increased violence as a result. He expects its passage will also increase gang violence, drug addiction and street crime. Jeff feels the measure was a 'sneaker' that fooled many voters.

The Club appreciated this riveting program by the District Attorney.
